

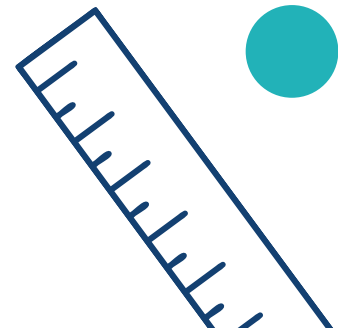

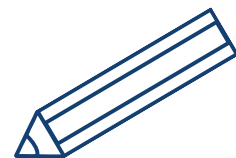

## Supportive Decision Making/Guardianship

Presenter: George Zaske

Supported Decision Making is an approach that can be used instead of guardianship or in conjunction with guardianship. The purpose of the presentation is to give parents the information necessary to consider the impact of either guardianship or supportive decision making as a way of supporting their child with a disability in adulthood.

Zaske is the parent of an adult son with a developmental disability. As an attorney he has worked with families to complete planning for the future of their child with a disability. He has presented at conferences in western Wisconsin on guardianship, supported decision making and the importance of community based services for individuals with disabilities.

## Long Term Care

Presenters: Amy White & Kelly Bien

Amy White & Kelly Bien from the Dunn County Aging and Disability Resource Office will discuss guardianship and long-term care options for youth 18 years and older. Long term care programming is comprehensive and flexible, offering services to foster independence and quality of life for members while recognizing the need for interdependence and support. Amy has been a Transition Coordinator and Social worker with the ADRC since 2016. She aids the transition from children's services to adult services and helps enroll individuals in Wisconsin's long term care programs. Kelly Bien is an Adult Protective Services Social Worker with Dunn County Human Services. Kelly works with youth 18+ and adults at risk to ensure they are not being abused or neglected. She also assists qualifying families with guardianship for vulnerable adults.
